Learners are encouraged to select familiar and relatable themes such as a family trip, the first day of a new school year, camping adventures, or a sleepover. To enhance realism and engagement, a simple problem or conflict may be incorporated into each scenario, for example, missing a flight during a family

vacation. For students with higher levels of English proficiency, collaborative dialogue construction is strongly recommended. Working together allows learners to negotiate meaning, share vocabulary, and refine their grammatical accuracy. Students are asked to assume specific roles and fully immerse themselves in their characters. In a family-based scenario, participants may take on the roles of parents and siblings, discussing possible solutions to an unexpected situation. This role-based interaction promotes spontaneous speech, pragmatic language use, and emotional expression. Teachers are encouraged to



foster creativity, humor, and dramatic elements, as these features increase motivation and reduce speaking anxiety. In addition to role-play activities, educational games serve as a powerful tool for language development. Games that incorporate commonly used English expressions, idioms, and popular phrases from television programs and films provide learners with exposure to authentic language use in an enjoyable format. Word-based board games that require strategic thinking and collaboration help learners internalize vocabulary and improve spelling skills. Quieter games, such as Scrabble, are particularly effective for expanding lexical knowledge and reinforcing word formation. During one-to-one or small-group tutoring sessions, teachers may actively support learners by guiding them in word selection and strategy use. This scaffolding approach ensures that students remain engaged while gradually developing independence. Overall, the integration of role-play, problem-based scenarios, and language-focused games creates a dynamic learning environment that supports both communicative competence and long-term language retention.

Creative and Participatory Learning Methods in English Language Education Creative Writing through the “Exquisite Corpse” Technique

One innovative approach to developing learners' creative and communicative abilities is the “Exquisite Corpse” writing technique. In this

collaborative activity, students are organized into small groups and provided with a specific communicative context, such as a telephone conversation, writing a personal letter, preparing for a sports competition, or reacting to unexpected weather conditions like a snow day. Each participant contributes one short sentence of no more than fifteen words related to the given topic. After writing their sentence, students fold the paper to conceal their contribution before passing it to the next participant. This process continues until all group members have contributed. Once completed, the sentences are revealed and read aloud. Due to the lack of shared context, the resulting text is often disjointed or humorous. Students are then encouraged to collaboratively rearrange the sentences into a coherent narrative. This stage develops logical sequencing, critical thinking, and pragmatic language use, while also reinforcing cooperation and negotiation skills essential for effective communication in English. In addition, this technique promotes learner autonomy and reduces anxiety, as students focus on collective meaning-making rather than individual accuracy.

Film-Based Dialogue Creation as a Communicative Tool

Another effective instructional strategy involves the use of film clips to stimulate spoken and written language production. In the Movie Clip Dialogue Project, students watch short scenes from well-known films with the sound muted and are asked to invent plausible



dialogues for the characters. This method encourages learners to interpret visual cues such as facial expressions, body language, and setting in order to construct meaningful conversations. For example, a scene from “The Wizard of Oz” can be used to create an imagined dialogue between Dorothy and the Good Witch, while a clip from “Beauty and the Beast” allows students to explore emotional language and polite expressions through a conversation between Belle and the Beast. Students record their dialogues in writing before performing them orally. When the original dialogue is later revealed, learners can compare linguistic choices, enhancing listening comprehension, cultural awareness, and pragmatic competence.
